



# INTERNATIONAL SYMPOSIUM ON REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH: OVERCOMING BARRIERS FOR RESEARCH IN REPRODUCTION.

Dear members of clinical and scientific community,

On behalf of the organizing committee, we invite you to participate in the “International Symposium on Reproductive Health: Overcoming barriers for research in reproduction (ISRH 2021)” organizing committee. The symposium will be held in a virtual format on **May 7th, 2021**.

ISRH2021 aims to gather worldwide young and senior researchers in reproductive biology. The symposium is focused on scientific, clinical and epidemiological evidence in the field of pre- and periconceptional healthcare and neonatal research, including maternal and paternal contribution to offspring development and health, endocrine disruptors and environmental cues effects, the impact of reproductive assisted techniques on embryo and offspring development, and the consequences of pathogens, infections and COVID-19 on gestation, lactation and offspring development, among others.

The symposium is free-of-charge so that attendees can overcome any financial problem that may discourage their assistance, as the spirit of this symposium is to create possibilities for worldwide participation at all career stages.

The scientific program includes four different sessions with the participation of internationally known researchers on the following topics:

- Maternal-fetal interface
- ARTs effects on embryo and offspring development.
- Paternal effects on fertility and offspring health.
- Maternal effects on pregnancy and offspring health.

There will also be early career researchers (ECRs) short talks in each session, selected based on abstract quality by a scientific committee.

A poster session will also be held on the topics mentioned above, and there will be a special session on “COVID-19, pathogens and reproductive health.”. Oral and poster presentations will have the option of being judged and selected for an award supported by our sponsor Societies.

ISRH2021 will also count with two different informal social events. Senior researchers and ECRs will discuss relatable topics and of interest to attendees at diverse stages of their careers.
